Course Objective

The main objective of the workshop, is to create a learning environment in which encourages and motivates the students to think creatively, to analyisis and negociate to try and improve and to collaborate and then communicate their results. Session Structure

The session is structured in such a way to ensure a range of varied activities.

- Introduction
- Team Building Games
- Design Challenge
- Review
- Presentation
- Playing their Games

The workshop consists of students in random teams creating a new sport. The students are given some basic rules and a time frame, also they are given some sports equipment and some vocabaulary and expressions to help them with their task. The students must divide the tasks, manage the time and design the rules of the game, but they must be creative (the game annot resemble any game that already exists. They must invent a name for the game, and in the final challenge they must explain their game to another team so that other team can play it.

Learning Outcomes

This very simple idea has many learning outcomes. The aim of this workshop is not to make a perfect game, but to raise awareness of how soft skills can sometimes be as or even more important than technical skills.
